LIGHTING

Lighting is one of the most cost-effective deterrents to criminal activity. Leaving lights on indoors when you are not home gives the impression that the home is occupied. If you are going to be away for an extended period, consider using timers to turn the lights on and off while you



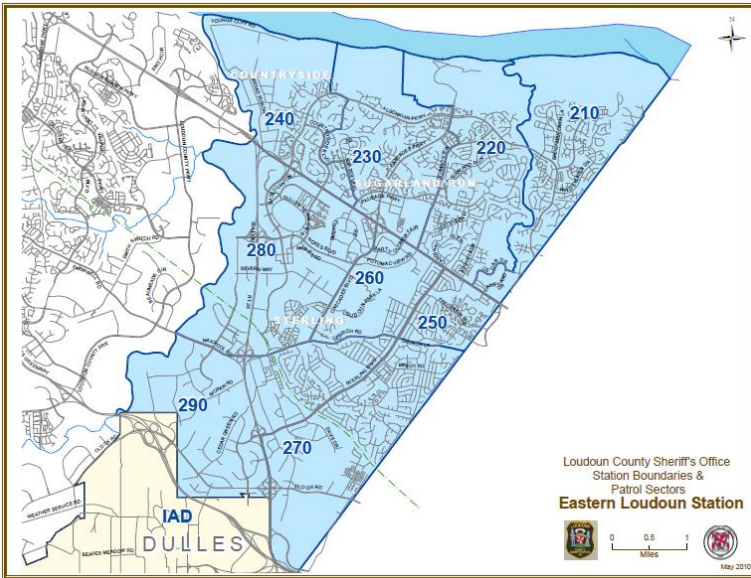

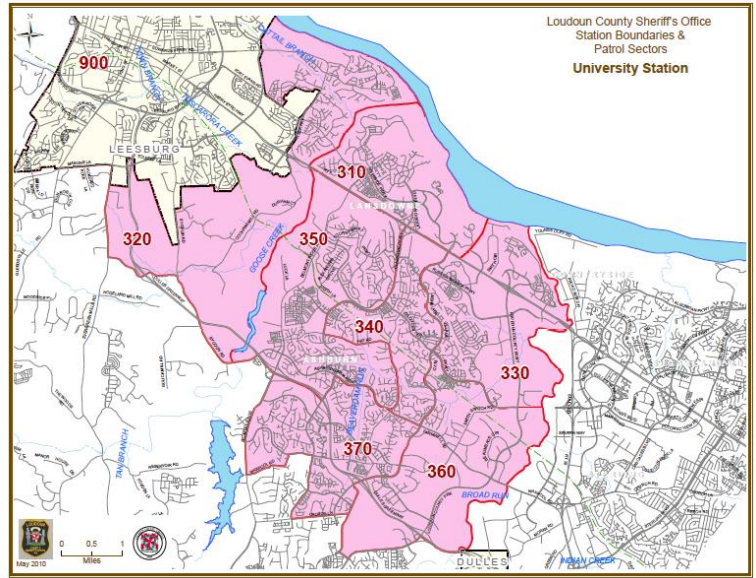
LED light bulbs are recommended.

Loudoun County Sheriff's Office STATION / SECTOR MAPS

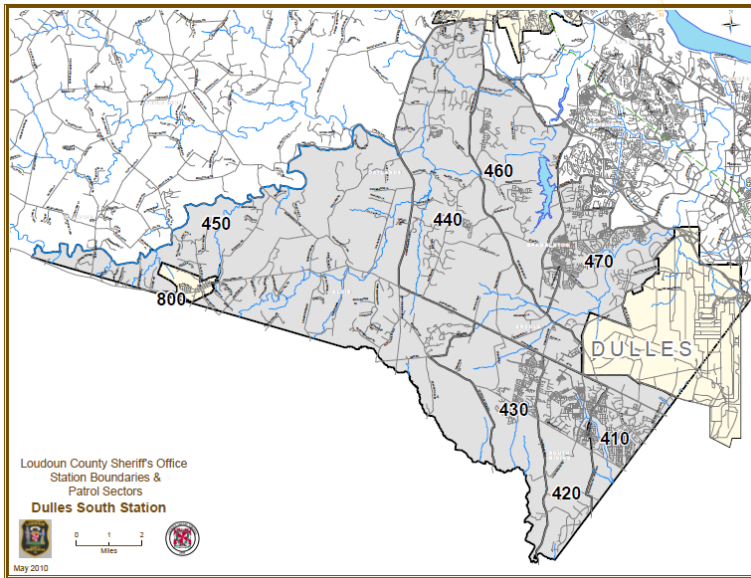
Eastern Loudoun Station: SECTOR 2
