## **What is Sexual Assault?**

Sexual assault can take many different forms and be defined in different ways, but one thing remains the same: it's never the victim's fault.

## **Who can get help?**

Any victim of and sexual assault, concerned persons in the community, professionals, law enforcement, anyone who needs information about sexual assault services and community resources may call. Interpretation services are available in any language.

## **After a Sexual Assault. Getting Support.**

After sexual assault, it's hard to know how to react. You may be physically hurt, emotionally drained, or unsure what to do next. You may be considering working with the criminal justice system but are unsure of where to start. Learning more about what steps you can take following sexual violence can help ground you in a difficult time. There is support.

## **Helping a Friend or Loved One**

It's not always easy to know what to say when someone tells you they've been sexually assaulted, especially when that person is a family member, friend, or loved one. Listen. Be there. Communicate without judgment. Seek support.
